The living water of the Holy Spirit

The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of living water, welling up into eternal life. This is a new kind of water, a living, leaping water, welling up for those who are worthy. But why did Christ call the grace of the Spirit water? Because all things are dependent on water; plants and animals have their origin in water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, and another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it.

In the same way the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, simple and indivisible, apportions grace to each man as he wills. Like a dry tree which puts forth shoots when watered, the soul bears the fruit of holiness when repentance has made it worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit. Although the Spirit never changes, the effects of this action, by the will of God and in the name of Christ, are both many and marvelous.

The Spirit makes one man a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, and enables another to interpret Holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one man's self-control, shows another how to help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism, makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, and trains another for martyrdom. His action is different in different people, but the Spirit himself is always the same. *In each person*, Scripture says, *the Spirit reveals his presence in a particular way for the common good*.

The Spirit comes gently and makes himself known by his fragrance. He is not felt as a burden, for he is light, very light. Rays of light and knowledge stream before him as he approaches. The Spirit comes with the tenderness of a true friend and protector to save, to heal, to teach, to counsel, to strengthen, to console. The Spirit comes to enlighten the mind first of the one who receives him, and then, through him, the minds of others as well.

As light strikes the eyes of a man who comes out of darkness into the sunshine and enables him to see clearly things he could not discern before, so light floods the soul of the man counted worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit and enables him to see things beyond the range of human vision, things hitherto undreamed of.

All women of the parish are invited to join!

One Hour, One Day, One Year

Each member commits to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week, thus covering a complete week. The commitment is to that day; the Seven Sister may pray at any time on that day. If she is unable to offer her Holy Hour, she is to secure a substitute either through the leader "Anchoress" or her spouse may be her substitute for that hour. This generous commitment of one hour per week of prayer is asked for a period of one year. The Holy Hour is ideally prayed in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament – either in an Adoration Chapel or in front of a Tabernacle – but not restricted to the parish of which the Seven Sister is a member. Thus, one can remain faithful to the commitment when traveling, when a parish does not offer Perpetual Adoration, or when there is limited access to a particular church. In the absence of an open parish or Perpetual Adoration Chapel, one may park their vehicle in the parking lot of a parish to pray, ideally closest to where to Tabernacle is. St. Columban can be opened for prayer upon request during office hours Monday – Thursday from 9:00AM to 2:00PM.

You can pray that God will send you the Holy Spirit


every day. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that God will give the Holy Spirit to whoever asks.




TRUE REFORMERS: EPISODE 3 ST. PHILIP NERI

When we struggle to feel loving, let us remember that love is a gift we receive from God. With the simple prayer, "Come Holy Spirit," we can invite him into our hearts. When the Spirit is present within us, so will be his fruit: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." (Galatians 5:22-23)

At Home with Faith

Talk

Here are some reflection questions to help you have **Great Conversations** with the whole family.

Encourage your children to invite the Holy Spirit into their hearts:

- Remind them that the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the virtues of faith, hope and love are gifts, not accidents. Let them know that love isn't just a feeling—it is God's gift to recognize and appreciate his goodness in creation. Share a story about how love came to you as a gift. For example, when my little sister was first born, I was jealous of her, but I came to love her as the Holy Spirit gradually worked on my heart.
- Encourage them to pray "Come Holy Spirit." Jesus promised he would send the Holy Spirit, and when our children say the simple prayer, "Come Holy Spirit," he sends the Holy Spirit to breathe new life into us. Teach this simple but powerful prayer, and encourage your children to use it.

Pentecost

Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The following prayer was recited by Pope Benedict XVI in a homily on November 7, 2006. This is a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Let us invoke him so that he will irrigate, warm and straighten, so that he will pervade us with the power of his sacred flame and renew the earth.

Let us pray for his with all our hearts at this time, in these days.


