A Word from Father Thompson



This weekend, of course, we have the announcement of the priest assignments. I am sorry that, due to a friend's wedding, I was not able to celebrate the Sunday Masses this weekend and thus was not able to announce the changeover personally. So, the letter read at Mass and this bulletin letter will need to suffice, I suppose.

First and most importantly, your new priests: Father Bryan Ochs will be the pastor of the new parish group of Sacred Heart Lacey and St Columban Yelm, and the three churches therein. Assisting him as parochial vicar will be a newly arrived extern priest from Malawi, Africa. The extern priest and Fr Ochs will be mainly in Lacey, with Fr Ochs visiting periodically for administrative oversight. This arrangement will help retain the status quo of service in both parishes during this initial period while the communities get to know one another and begin to collaborate.

As you know, the reorganization of the Archdiocese is not merely about spreading out priests more efficiently, it is also a project with a goal of reevaluating the state of our parishes and making the changes needed to provide a more vital future for local parishes and the Archdiocese as a whole. Looking out over various parishes of the Archdiocese and with whom and how they are being partnered up, this will clearly involve making changes and decisions that, while perhaps difficult, I think have obviously been coming for a long time. Fortunately, the Archbishop wants to make sure such changes are not merely imposed from above but come from conversations among the people of the parishes that are making such changes. In some places, this may look like adjusting, adding, relocating, or ending some Mass times and parish programs based on truly blue-sky thinking among the people; in other places this may look like a process of the people recognizing and coming to grieve, but to accept, the closure of this or that campus they kind of knew was coming one day; in yet other places this might look like retaining ownership of a campus no longer used for Mass and repurposing it for some kind of program or ministry; in yet other cases... you get the idea. However it will play out for us, I cannot say, but I trust Fr Ochs will help you though it with aplomb and care. He is a very good priest, and I think he would be very friendly to the culture of authentic and beautiful expression of our faith that St Columban has built up.

As for me, for those who may wonder. I will be reassigned to St Rose parish in Longview and the various other communities (it is a mix of missions of that parish and other churches that are still legally parishes) of Cowlitz county. Working with me will be Fr Vinner Raj Simeon Raj, who is presently in Pacific County.

These next few years will be difficult, to be sure, but if we are realistic, focused on the mission of founding a new parish (which may, and probably will, still operate multiple campuses), and resist maintaining an unsustainable status quo out of fear or selfishness, we will come out the other side in a much better position as a Church and parish than we are in at present.

In the spirit of Mary our Mother, the daughters strive to be attentive to the spiritual and corporal needs of our pastor, parish, and community through service and prayer. Homebound Ministry

Ministers are trained to bring Holy Communion to those who cannot physically attend Mass due to health constraints, servicing local care facilities and private residences in our area.

Liturgical Ministries

The laity assist with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass through various roles. Ordinarily, attendance of Sunday Mass and union of one's prayers to that of the priest and the Church during the Mass fulfills this role. Parishioners with certain talents also can volunteer as **Greeters, Ushers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion** (EMHC), and members of the **Choir** (Music Ministry) to assist our community in our Sunday worship. Additionally, boys who have already received their First Holy Communion are trained to become Altar Servers. All these roles help the greater Body of Christ at our church; if you feel called to assist in any Liturgical Ministry please contact us at the Parish Office.

Knights of Columbus

Council 17152 meets monthly third Wednesdays of every month.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul

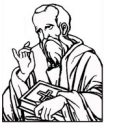

Promises of The Chaplet of Divine Mercy

When we pray the Chaplet of Mercy with trust in Jesus, we can receive many blessings from the Lord for ourselves and others. Jesus told St. Faustina to write these things down in her Diary. Here are some of the things Jesus said. (The number at the end of the sentence is the number of the paragraph in the Diary that contains the words of Jesus). My daughter, encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you (Diary 1541). Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will (1731). Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). Say the chaplet I have taught you, and the storm will cease (1731).

Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)/Adult Faith Formation



The third precept ("You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season.") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian

liturgy. 84

This reception of the Eucharist can take place within or outside of Mass. For Catholics in the United States, the period for satisfying this precept has been extended beyond what, liturgically speaking, is the Easter season, to run from the First Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (after Pentecost). By canon law, though, any just cause allows the precept to be fulfilled at any time of the year (1983 CIC 920).

Bible Studies - Adult Scripture Study meet weekly on Thursday evenings to discuss the upcoming Sunday Mass readings, using Lectio Divina and through Catholic exegesis. Contact the parish office to learn more.

Sacrament of Matrimony - Contact the parish office to schedule a meeting with Father.

Sacrament of Baptism - Baptisms are celebrated during Mass on Sundays or shortly after. (Except during Lent) Before scheduling a date, the following are needed: (1) Registration paperwork, (2) Birth Certificate or adoption forms., (3) Godparent/ sponsor forms, (4) Baptism preparation class certificate.

Fun Fact! Asperges or "The Sprinkling Rite" takes place on special days. The congregation is sprinkled with holy water, recalling their baptisms.

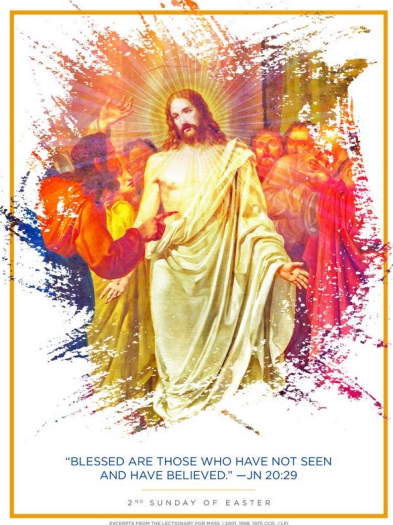

We hear how the early Christians lived in unity and holiness, bearing witness to Jesus, and living in community as friends. Which of these traits do you see at work in your faith community?

Psalm: *Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his love is everlasting. (Ps 118)*

Second Reading: *For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. (1 Jn 5:3-4)*

John teaches his community that our faith in Jesus helps us “conquer the world.” What struggles are you facing that you need to confront and defeat?

Gospel: *One the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them “Peace be with you” (Jn 20:19)*

The risen Jesus meets Thomas in the midst of his doubt and encourages him to believe. Who could you encourage this week to have faith in the resurrection of Jesus?

Divine Mercy Sunday

Question:

Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer:

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”

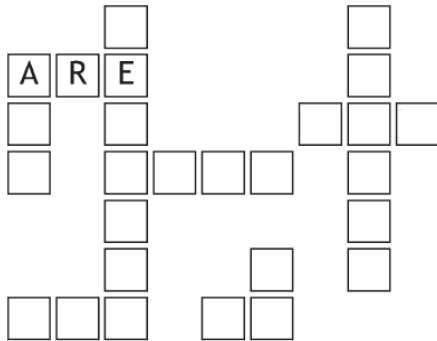

Spring 2024 Update

Last February, the final parish families were announced across the archdiocese, and in March, all pastors and key parish leadership attended in-person regional trainings focused on the next phases of the Partners in the Gospel journey. They learned about the key activities



Phase 0: Prepare

We are currently in Phase Zero, which is a time of preparation. Please continue to pray for this effort. Specifically, we pray that parishioners open their hearts to the Holy Spirit and that the Holy Spirit helps lead us on this journey. We also ask everyone to pray for the Priest Placement Board and our priests as they work together to find the best fit leaders for our parishes.

Q&A: What is the role of the parish liaison?

Parish Liaisons are professionals, hired and trained by the Archdiocese of Seattle, who will work in partnership with multiple parish families' pastors and their leadership teams to implement the parish family structure. Each liaison will provide guidance, project management support, and ensure effective communication between the Partners in the Gospel core team, parish family pastor and staff, and the Planning and Mission Effectiveness team. The liaison will also support the parish in the creation of the One Parish Plan, which will be presented to the archbishop (in about three years for most parish families) before becoming one canonical parish. Liaisons have started working with parishes.



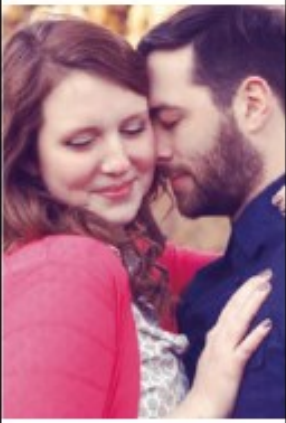
How were new pastors chosen?

Every year, the Archdiocese of Seattle's Priest Personnel Board meets to discuss where the archdiocese's priests will be assigned as pastors, priest administrators, parochial vicars or parish priests.

In a typical year, only some pastors will reach the end of their appointed terms and move to new parish assignments. This year, however, most pastors are expected to change assignments under the archdiocese's new model of parish families that are being created July 1, 2024, explained Father Gary Zender, the archdiocese's vicar for clergy and pastor of St. Louise Parish in Bellevue. This new model is part of the Partners in the Gospel strategic planning initiative.

Pastor assignments are currently being announced throughout the Easter season. With many of us welcoming new pastors and parochial vicars this July, *Northwest Catholic* sat down with Father Zender to learn about challenges
