# Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

**400** The harmony in which they had found themselves, thanks to original justice, is now destroyed: the control of the soul's spiritual faculties over the body is shattered; the union of man and woman becomes subject to tensions, their relations henceforth marked by lust and domination. Harmony with creation is broken: visible creation has become alien and hostile to man. Because of man, creation is now subject "to its bondage to decay". Finally, the consequence explicitly foretold for this disobedience will come true: man will "return to the ground", for out of it he was taken. Death makes its entrance into human history.

St. Paul urges the Corinthians to be confident that despite our current afflictions and discouragements, God has given us an abundance of grace and has prepared for us eternal glory. Who might need to hear this message of hope from you?

## Gospel

And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand; that is the end of him. (Mk 3:26)

As he began his public ministry in Galilee, Jesus redefined "family" as whoever does the will of God. What would you say is "the will of God?"

A Word from Father Thompson

One of my favorite Latin proverbs is Fabri Fabricando Fimus – “We become carpenters by carving.” It is a great proverb because it is a challenge and encouragement both for those who are leading others as well as those who are learning.



For the learner, it is an encouragement that practice makes perfect, as well as the challenge that one will never accomplish anything unless one has the humility to run the risk of being imperfect at first. For those who lead and teach, it encourages patience with learners, but also constitutes a challenge for oneself: As one presently in the position of competence and activity, one must be willing to take the risk of trusting those more junior, realizing that their efforts may may take longer to accomplish, and may not end up as good as our own products and services right now. We take that risk because we know the learner will never improve if his skills are never in fact exercised.

No matter how excellent a teacher is, or how skilled he is in his own right, the one and only way to make a man a carpenter is to put saw and hammer in his hand. Education in theory, critique of practice work, trusting him with small tasks is indispensable too, but there is no way around the fact that at some point he will need to be entrusted with a whole project. The first few pieces may not be perfect, but only more carving and gentle encouragement is going to help that.

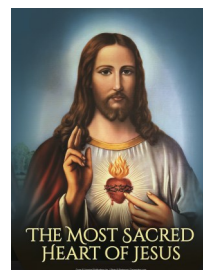
Our culture has to a great degree lost a sense of this. People young and old are very entitled, arrogant, and even fearful in their own ways. We all know the stereotype of the young person who expects the standard of living they had in his parents’ home and is unwilling to start at the bottom. There is even a phenomenon of “quiet quitting” that refuses to strive in one’s career unless rewards are given in advance; a desire to be called a carpenter before one is willing to pick up a tool. At the same time, we also know the entitlement of us who are already established in our lives, unwilling to be patient with people who are new at their trades, expecting every good and service to be as flawless as if it had been done by a robot.

We need to be more patient and more human with one another.

## From the Washington State Catholic Conference

### Faithful and Civil Political Engagement,

May 27, 2024

As the 2024 election season begins, we encourage all Catholics serve as ambassadors of civility and to exercise our right and responsibility of political engagement prayerfully, thoughtfully and in accordance with our faith-beliefs to promote common good and the dignity and sanctity of every life.

Each election year, we must remember to:

Never let evil talk pass your lips; say only the good things men need to hear, things that will really help them. Do nothing that will sadden the Holy Spirit with whom you were sealed against the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, all passion and anger, harsh words, slander, and malice of every kind. In place of these, be kind to one another, compassionate, and mutually forgiving, just as God has forgiven you in Christ (Eph. 4:29-32).

With these words of wisdom from St. Paul, we encourage you to engage respectfully with others to improve civil dialogue and our entire political system.

We are privileged to live in a nation which sees participation in free and fair elections as a right. With that right comes a responsibility to exercise our vote by first forming our individual consciences to make well-reasoned decisions grounded in our faith. This is not a quick or easy process, and our voting decisions can be difficult to make. But taking the time to review



and reflect on the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* allows each of us to base our votes in faith, rather than political rhetoric, and promote the good of all our brothers and sisters to the best of our ability.

We must also set a better example for political discourse than we see in all forms of media and increasingly from candidates. Our discourse should begin with listening and prayer, especially when we disagree. As the bishops at the Second Vatican Council urged Catholics: "Respect and love ought to be extended also to those who think or act differently than we do in social, political and even religious matters. In fact, the more deeply we come to understand their ways of thinking through such courtesy and love, the more easily will we be able to enter into dialogue with them" (*Gaudium et Spes*, no. 28). Dialogue helps us to better understand one another and the potential moral, social, political and economic ramifications of our political decisions.

We invite you to spend time with *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* and to recommit with Catholics across the United States to the *Civilize It* campaign. As you may recall from the 2020 presidential election year, *Civilize It* involves taking the pledge below to promote civility, love our neighbors, and build community.

#### I PLEDGE:

1. Civility – To recognize the human dignity of those with whom I disagree, treat others with respect, and rise above attacks when directed at me.
2. Clarity – To root my political viewpoints in the Gospel and a well-formed conscience, which involves prayer, conversation, study and listening. I will stand up for my convictions and speak out when I witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.
3. Compassion – To encounter others with a tone and posture which affirms that I honor the dignity of others and invites others to do the same. I will presume others' best intentions and listen to their stories with empathy. I will strive to understand before seeking to be understood.

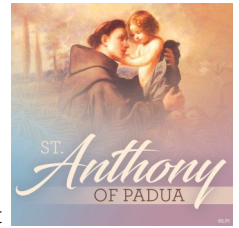

### Saint of the Week—St. Anthony of Padua (Feast day June 13)

In 1221 St. Francis held a general chapter at Assisi; when the others dispersed, there lingered behind, unknown and neglected, a poor Portuguese friar, resolved to ask for and to refuse nothing. Nine months later, Fra Antonio rose under obedience to preach to the religious assembled at Forli, when, as the discourse proceeded, "the Hammer of Heretics," "the Ark of the Testament," "the eldest son of St. Francis," stood revealed in all his sanctity, learning, and eloquence before his rapt and astonished brethren.

Devoted from earliest youth to prayer and study among the Canons Regular, Ferdinand de Bulloens, as his name was in the world, had been stirred, by the spirit and example of the first five Franciscan martyrs, to put on their habit and preach the Faith to the Moors in Africa. Denied a martyr's palm, and enfeebled by sickness, at the age of twenty-seven he was taking silent but merciless revenge upon himself in the humblest offices of his community. From this obscurity he was now called forth, and for nine years France, Italy, and Sicily heard his voice, saw his miracles, and men's hearts turned to God. One night, when St. Antony was staying with a friend in the city of Padua, his host saw brilliant rays streaming under the door of the Saint's room, and on looking through the keyhole he beheld a little Child of marvelous beauty standing upon a book which lay open upon the table, and clinging with both arms round Antony's neck. With an ineffable sweetness he watched the tender caresses of the Saint and his wondrous Visitor. At last the Child vanished, and Fra Antonio, opening the door, charged his friend, by the love of Him Whom he had seen, to "tell the vision to no man" as long as he was alive. Suddenly, in 1231, our Saint's brief apostolate was closed, and the voices of children were heard crying along the streets of Padua, "Our father, St. Antony, is dead." The following year, the church-bells of Lisbon rang without ringers, while at Rome one of its sons was inscribed among the Saints of God.

Reflection.—Let us love to pray and labor unseen, and cherish in the secret of our hearts the graces of God and the growth of our immortal souls. Like St. Antony, let us attend to this, and leave the rest to God.

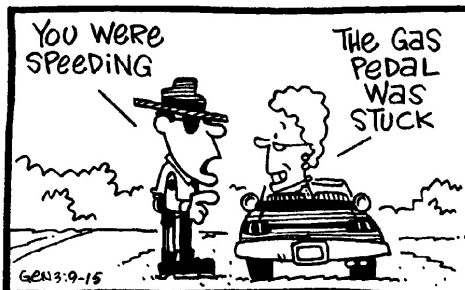
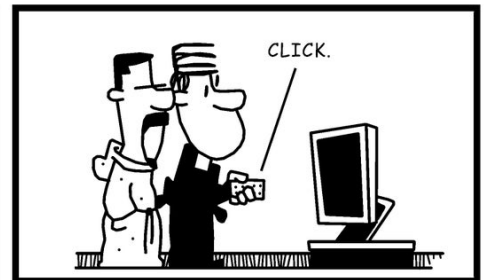
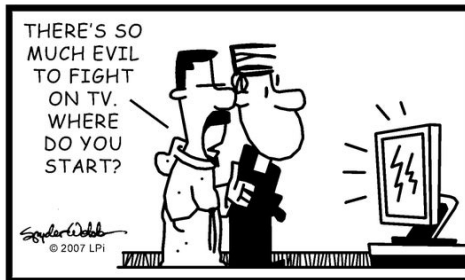

### St. Anthony Can Find Anything — Even You

“Tony, Tony, come around! Something is lost and it must be found.”

Did you learn this one when you were a kid? In my experience there are even a lot of lapsed Catholics — or people who were never Catholic at all — who know that when you lose something, St. Anthony becomes your best friend. Missing keys? Pray to St. Anthony. Can't find your favorite sweater? St. Anthony. Forget where you parked your car in the mall lot? St. Anth— okay, you get the idea. Whatever it is, large or small, important or trivial, Tony has a reputation for finding the lost things.

It's a devotion that can seem a little like superstition — witchcraft, even? — if you don't really understand it. Mumble an incantation to a dead guy and you're guaranteed to find your sunglasses. But as with most traditions that are old, beloved and effective, looking a little closer reveals the truth of the matter.

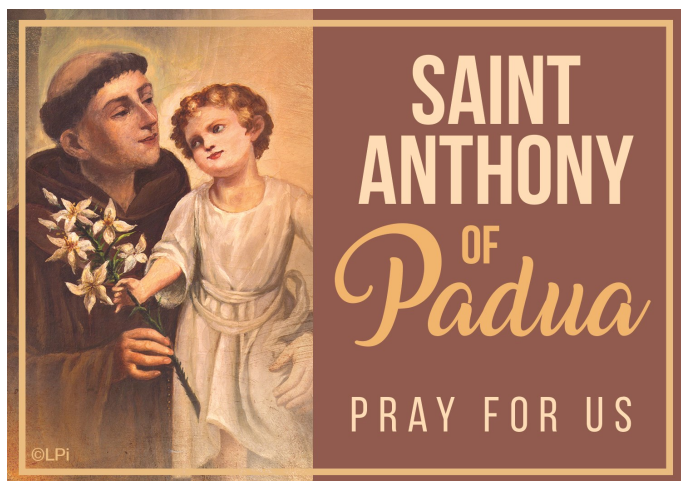
When we lose something really important, what do we do? We make the whole household stop what they're doing to join the search. Having St. Anthony as a friend means you ask him to stop what he's doing to help, too. And how he helps is by taking the matter exactly where all matters need to go — straight to the feet of Christ.

Here's the real genius of St Anthony: he takes the most mundane, commonplace occurrence — misplacing socks — into an encounter with the divine and truly all things great and small are gifts from God. He grabs our hand and points to the cross. “That's what you're looking for,” he tells us.

In the end, Tony doesn't really find the lost things. He finds the lost people.

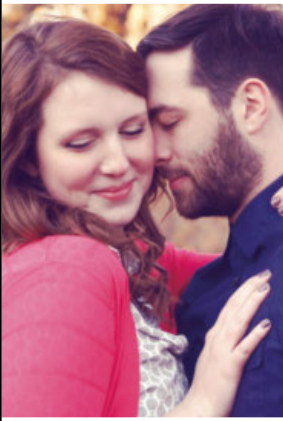
