From the Catechism of the Catholic Church



1617 The entire Christian life bears the mark of the spousal love of Christ and the Church. Already Baptism, the entry into the People of God, is a nuptial mystery; it is so to speak the nuptial bath, which precedes the wedding feast, the Eucharist. Christian marriage in its turn becomes an efficacious sign, the sacrament of the covenant of Christ and the Church. Since it signifies and communicates grace, marriage between baptized persons is a true sacrament of the New Covenant.

We have also been present in Tenino since 1891 through St. Peter Mission, named for the apostle and first pope.*

A Word from our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I'd like to offer just a brief assessment of how things are going as we transition under new leadership, as well as transitioning into a parish family and collaborating across the parishes and missions of Yelm, Lacey, and Tenino.

I guess I'll start with what hasn't gone well because, why not? For me, the biggest frustration so far has been that I just haven't made it out to Tenino and Yelm as much as I would like. It was always going to be the case that I'd be in Lacey more than Yelm and Tenino, but the amount of time at those locations has been less than I expected. So that hasn't been good.

Part of this is because we are still short one priest, but I have some good news on that! Fr. William Dodoma's meeting at the embassy in Malawi went very well, and he should have his visa by the time you read this. In fact, he might already be in the United States by the time you read this. He will need a few days to adjust, of course, but once he is able to begin doing ministry here it should free up some time to go to Yelm and Tenino.

While frustrating, the short amount of time I've spent in Tenino and Yelm would have been more frustrating had Fr. Martin not been here to provide such great care to these communities. He has enjoyed his time there, and I know that he has served these communities well. It's made a challenging set of circumstances far less challenging.

Now as for things that are going well, I must say that personally I am very happy where I am. The hospitality from our local parishes so far has been very heart warming. I have met many friendly and happy people from our parishes and my first impression of the parishes is that they are happy and holy communities. What priest wouldn't want that?

I especially want to acknowledge the staff members of these parishes. This has been a big change for them, and they have handled the challenges with a great deal of professionalism and grace. It is no wonder the parishes seem so healthy. They have been served by wonderful staff. I'm looking forward to continue getting to know them and to see our ministries bear fruit.

Moving forward, the plan for now is to continue to get to know each other and see how things run. We all know that the busyness around our parishes is going to tick up a couple of notches once school starts and faith formation classes begin. There is still a lot I have to learn about the culture of these three communities and, as has been said, I don't anticipate any big changes in the near future.

So I will continue to plug away speaking with parishioners about the wonderful things going on in our parishes, and trying to lead us all in the ways of holiness. Thank you all for your continued patience and prayers.

Saint of the Week

St. Augustine of Hippo, Bishop & Doctor of the Church (August 28)

ST. AUGUSTINE was born in 354, at Tagaste in Africa. He was brought up in the Christian faith, but without receiving baptism. An ambitious school-boy of brilliant talents and violent passions, he early lost both his faith and his innocence. He persisted in his irregular life until he was thirty-two. Being then at Milan professing rhetoric, he tells us that the faith of his childhood had regained possession of his intellect, but that he could not as yet resolve to break the chains of evil habit. One day, a however, stung to the heart by the account of some sudden conversions, he cried out, "The unlearned rise and storm heaven, and we, with all our learning, for lack of heart lie wallowing here." He then withdrew into a garden, when a long and terrible conflict ensued. Suddenly a young fresh voice (he knows not whose) breaks in upon his strife with the words, "Take and read;" and he lights upon the passage beginning,



"Walk honestly as in the day." The battle was won. He received baptism, returned home, and gave all to the poor. At Hippo, where he settled, he was consecrated bishop in 395. For thirty-five years he was the center of ecclesiastical life in Africa, and the Church's mightiest champion against heresy; whilst his writings have been everywhere accepted as one of the principal sources of devotional thought and theological speculation. He died in 430. St. Augustine, pray for us!

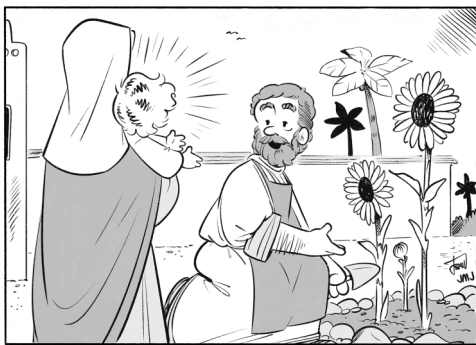
Q&A

What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?
