St. Columban Parish consists of two worship sites: the parish church in Yelm and the mission church, St. Peter, in Tenino.

We proclaim the Roman Catholic faith to the communities of McKenna, Nisqually, Rainier, Roy, Tenino, and Yelm in southeast Thurston and southwest Pierce counties. Our community has grown since its origins at the former St. Margaret Mary Church in McKenna, and our current church in Yelm is named for the Irish-born 6th century missionary to Europe St. Columbanus of Bobbio. This community dates back to its establishment in 1916. Our presence in Tenino dates back to 1891 through St. Peter Mission, named for the apostle and first pope.

This Annual Report is a snapshot of our parish community during the parish year ending June 30, 2024, which was the last year of our priest administrator Fr. Brian Thompson.

We welcomed Fr. Thompson in July 2021, leading us out of the pandemic. He was responsible for hiring our current bookkeeper and for the continuation of our parish operations and the reconvening of our parish council, the St. Peter Advisory commission, and the finance councils.

For clarity, some statistics, finances, and sacramental data are reported separately for St. Peter Mission. As an overall parish, Religious Education programs are reported together, although classes and administration takes place in Yelm.








Financial Stewardship

St. Columban received a slight increase in charitable giving this year, while also decreasing its expenditures by 119.4% from the previous year. This is due to no longer paying insurance for the organ in the hall and saving money on utility payments, such as gas expenses. This trend can been seen with St. Peter Mission as well. There was a slight increase in charitable giving with a very substantial decrease in expenses, allowing St. Peter Mission to save \$17,631.91. This is due to Pastoral Services dropping by 51.9%.

St. Columban gave \$2,321.18 to the CRS Rice Bowl, and St. Peter gave \$169.

The Commission reviewed and discussed issues and suggestions, made recommendations and helped implement projects and changes at St. Peter Mission.

- The mission currently has one staff person (maintenance) and has been managing with all volunteer workers and have been blessed with some dedicated ministry volunteers.
- We established a formal Home Ministry program for administering Holy Eucharist to home-bound parishioners
- The kitchen flooring and flooring for both restrooms were all replaced with vinyl plank flooring. The bell tower, walkways and north exterior wall of the church were pressure-washed.
- Annual landscaping contracted maintenance included root treatment of the arborvitae trees.
- Parking lot was restriped and cracks sealed.
- St. Peter Mission again met and exceeded our Annual Catholic Appeal goal.

In March of 2024 our current Treasurer Theresa
Gonzales had a severe fall and Dawn Bauer has taken
on her duties in her absence; prayers continue for her
recovery. The Private Prayer Chain continues under the
direction of Sandy Story in an ongoing effort to support
private prayers requested. Cards of Comfort: Ongoing effort of signed
encouraging cards from parishioners (NOT just the women) are
distributed to residents of Rosemont and Easthaven Villa with special
emphasis for holidays such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, and even
Father's Day and Mother's Day. We expanded our Fellowship hours to
twice a month, the Daughters of Mary host on the 1st Sunday of the month
and then partner with the Altar Society to host on the 2nd Sunday of the
month. Those that attend seem to appreciate the effort made.

The Christmas Giving Tree program continued with parishioners purchasing gift cards of specific amounts, which are distributed to those families in need by our St. Vincent de Paul ministry. This continues to receive a HUGE response from parishioners.

We hosted a handful of receptions this year for funerals, prepared and served food at the Parish Annual Picnic, in cooperation with the Knights of Columbus. Annual Spring Bazaar was held in May, which was also in cooperation with the Knights of Columbus Outdoor Sale. Generous donations of baked goods, indoor and outdoor plants and a large assortment of books made the sale a success.

We held First Communion and Confirmation receptions in May and June. A total of five Communicants and seven Confirmands and their families were celebrated. At the Father's Day Brunch, about 45 people total were served a delicious quiche breakfast. During the Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids Annual Car Show the DOM sold hot dogs, fries, chips, soda, and water as a fundraiser for future events. The Seven Sisters Apostolate had a successful third year of praying for our Priest. We are looking forward to adding more volunteers this coming year.


We meet on the fourth Tuesday each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall. All women of the church are invited and bring you r favorite snack to share!



Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP)—St. Columban Conference

The Saint Columban Chapter of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has seven members and two associate members. It was formed over 20 years ago for the spiritual formation of its members and assistance to the poor. It serves the Yelm area including Rainier, McKenna. Roy and Tenino. Its primary source of

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income comes from donations from St. Columban parishioners, fundraising from the yearly Walk for the Poor in September, and grants from local organizations that are more fully described below. Its members meet monthly on the third Thursday in the parish hall from 7-8:15 p.m.

St. Vincent de Paul aided the poor in the following areas this year:

- Utilities \$7,772
- Rent Subsidies \$7,125
- Food/Gas Cards \$3,790
- Propane/Other \$2,400

The Winter Clothes Closet supports the needs of the people residing in our geographical parish by providing much-needed clothing and other items. Last year, we were able to serve over 250 people; which was the largest number of people served in our seven-year history. This could not have been accomplished without the generous donations from our parishioners, the support of the Knights of Columbus, our St. Vincent de Paul Society, and our dedicated volunteers. We will re-open in November.














Are you registered?
