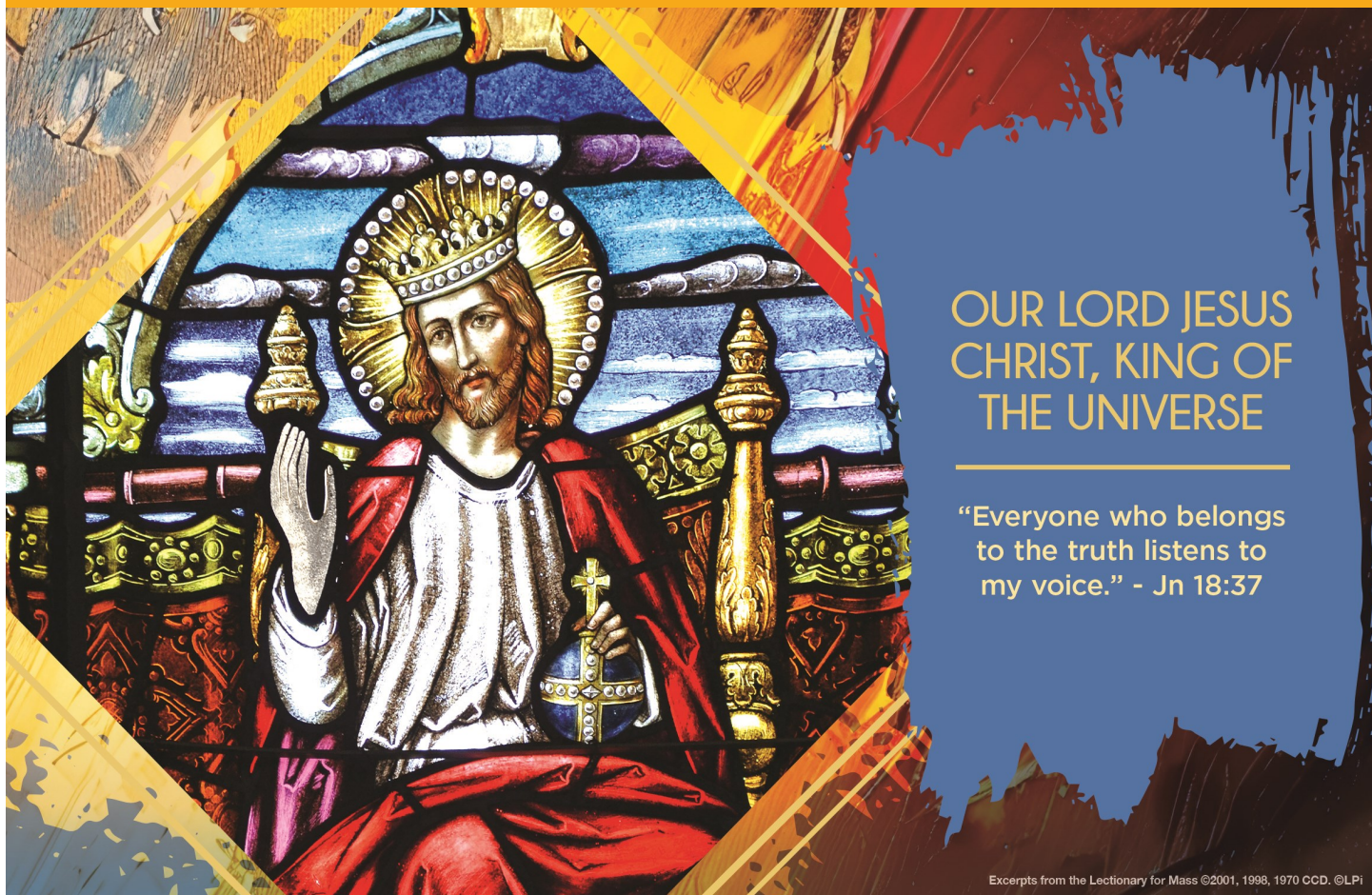

The Lord sits as King for ever. The Lord will bless his people with peace.

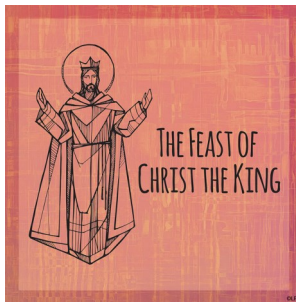

Our community has grown since its origins at the former St. Margaret Mary Church in McKenna, and our current church in Yelm is named for the Irish-born 6th century missionary to Europe St. Columbanus of Bobbio. We have also been present in Tenino since 1891 through St. Peter Mission, named for the apostle and first pope.*

Did you know our front pews are always empty? Be closer to the Lord and sit closer to the altar next Sunday.

A Word from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As so many of you know, the Archdiocese of Seattle is undergoing a process of reorganization called, Partners in the Gospel. The outcome of this process will be that our parishes will be even more successful at fulfilling our mission, which is to baptize people into the family of God and to teach them to follow all that Jesus commands.



The first stage of this process is to place us in Parish Families, which are groupings of parishes. Our parish family consists of Sacred Heart in Lacey, St. Columban's in Yelm, and St. Peter Mission in Tenino. So far, I have spent my time getting to know our parishioners and learning about these communities.

So far, so good, but as we move forward in the process, I am going to need a lot of help. This help includes the formation of a Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC). The PFAC is a group of parishioners who will spend time reflecting on the mission of the Church and how we can deepen our lives as disciples. It is like a parish council however it will oversee the work of all our parishes.

The PFAC will most definitely have members from each of our communities, and it will be a fairly significant time commitment. We will be meeting at least monthly, but often more often than that. We will be answering several important questions including, "Who are we as

a Parish Family?" and "What does God want us to become?" We will then, with the help of the Holy Spirit, begin charting this course.

I need your help to find members of this Parish Family Advisory Council, and I'm hoping that you will start to think of people who might have the skills we need to make this successful. We are looking for people who are strategic thinkers who can look at long term realities as well as creative thinkers who can think outside of the box.

In addition to strategic thinkers, we also need people skilled at managing and accounting for resources, ministering to the needs of others and of course, people with spiritual gifts of prayer and discernment. The term of this advisory committee will be about three years.

From the Catechism

671 Though already present in his Church, Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled "with power and great glory" by the King's return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover. Until everything is subject to him, "until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in her sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass, and she herself takes her place among the creatures which groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God." That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ's return by saying to him: *4 Marana tha!* "Our Lord, come!"

More about St. Columban!

Here's some more trivia about our patron saint, for your edification.

His Name Means Dove: Columbanus is the Latinized form of the Gaelic Columban, meaning little white dove, symbolizing the Holy Spirit. The Hebrew form of his name is Jonas, which is also the name of the monk who composed his well-known biography. He is not to be confused with St. Columba/Columkille who preceded him and was an Irish missionary to Scotland.

God-given Good Looks Jonas says Columban's "fine figure, his splendid color, and his noble manliness made him bellowed by all." This caused a problem: "He aroused the lust of lascivious maidens, especially of those who fine figure and superficial beauty are wont to enkindle mad desires in the minds of wretched men." An abbess advised Columban to flee temptation to the sins of the flesh and not to rouse it in others.

No Animal Can Distract him from Prayer: Many legends abound about his ability to tame animals, especially if they disturb him while attempting to pray outdoors in solitude. The Sign of the Cross and a plea to the Lord helped to repel wolves who came up to attack him. In another instance, with little effort, he convinced a bear to exit a cave so he can quietly pray alone.

Patron of Motorcyclists: It was said that St. Columban's extensive missionary travels made him "love the open road." thus his patronage for motorcyclists, who leave home to travel long distances seeking adventure.

Q&A

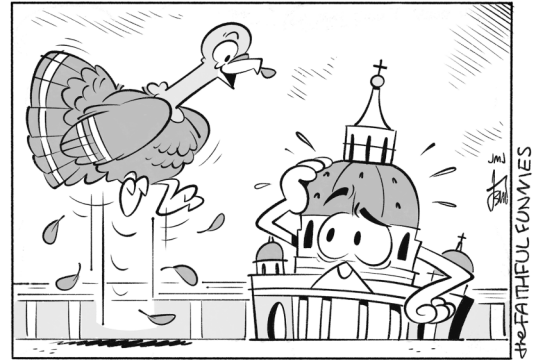
Question: What is a sacramental seal and where did it come from?

Answer: Leaving more than just a memory, there are some events in our life that are truly transforming, making us different people. The same thing can be said of spiritual things, especially sacraments. A sacramental seal or character is a theological concept to describe the life-changing and permanent effect of three sacraments on the person: baptism, confirmation, and holy orders. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that these sacraments confer a seal "by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood and is made a member of the Church according to different states and functions. This configuration to Christ and the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible" (#1121).

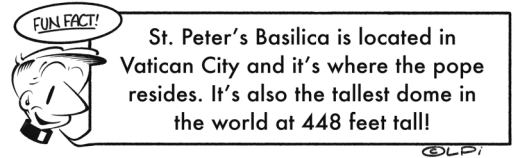
Once we receive these sacraments, we are forever changed. It's a spiritual "point of no return" whereby we take a step forward in our faith journey.

The HSPT is a standardized test administered to 8th graders that helps schools know where to place students academically when they enter high school. The test takes approximately three hours to complete and an essay will be administered after the standardized portion of the test.

We host a Prospective Parent Information Session during the first hour of the HSPT for parents and guardians. The HSPT can be shared with any school that accepts the HSPT regardless of where it was proctored.

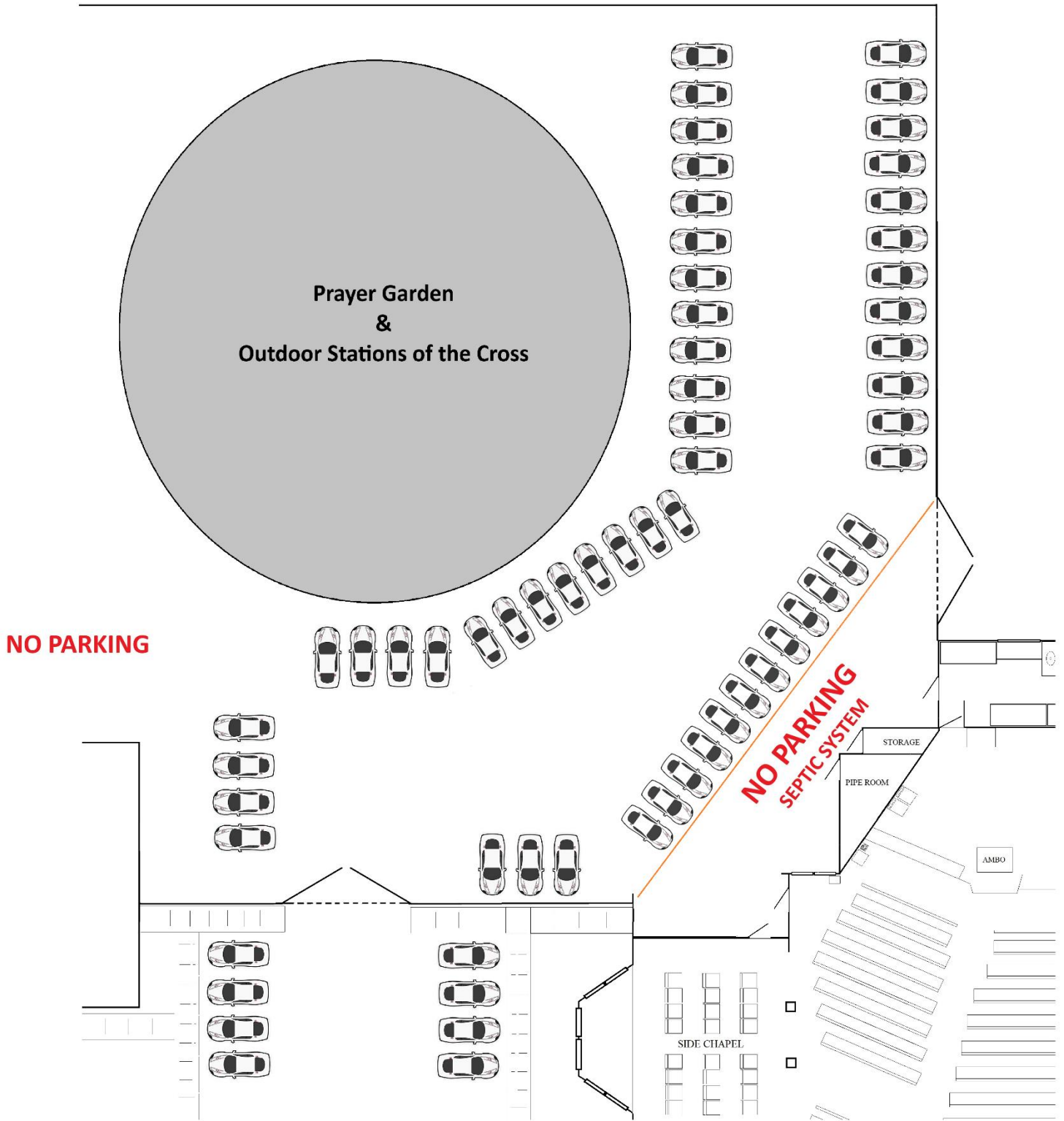

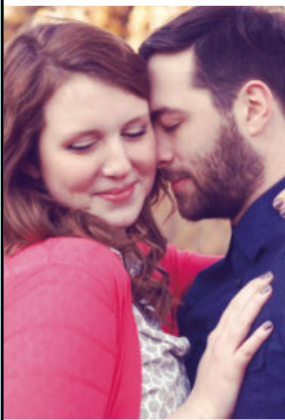
