

WELCOME TO SAINT COLUMBAN We proclaim the Roman Catholic faith to the communities of McKenna, Nisqually, Rainier, Roy, Tenino, and Yelm in southeast Thurston and southwest Pierce counties. Our community has grown since its origins at the former St. Margaret Mary Church in McKenna, and our current church in Yelm is named for the Irish-born 6th century missionary to Europe St. Columbanus of Bobbio. We have also been present in Tenino since 1891 through St. Peter Mission, named for the apostle and first pope.

Did you know our front pews are always empty? Be closer to the Lord and sit closer to the altar next Sunday.

A Word from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

This kind of snuck up on me, but the year 2025 is going to be a pretty important year as far as the Church goes, as we will celebrate a Jubilee year. This occurs every 25 years and marks a year of conversion for the faithful. This year's jub



conversion for the faithful. This year's jubilee will begin on Christmas Eve.

The concept of a jubilee comes from the Old Testament. You can read about it in Leviticus 25, 8-22. A few of the highlights are that it was a homecoming of sorts. People would return to their land, to reunite with their families. Slaves were to be set free, and debts were to be forgiven.

The Catholic Church took this concept and Christianized it, although it is a relatively late development with the first known Jubilee year celebrated in 1300. During a Jubilee year, Christians are encouraged to make a pilgrimage to Rome to walk through the "Holy Door", or some other important place for the faith. We are also called to reconcile with family and offer forgiveness to those who are in debt to us, but the primary hope for the Jubilee is a conversion of heart and a deepening of the way we live our faith.

I want to encourage you to commemorate this year as best as you can. Very few of us will be able to travel to Rome, but there are little things we can do to experience the grace of this Holy Year. You can read more about the Jubilee online, and there are quite a few YouTube videos with ideas of what you can do.

I also want to encourage you to read the "Papal Bull," called *Spes Non Confudit*, or, *Hope Does Not Disappoint*. I found the letter quite hopeful, which is good, considering the theme is Hope! In this document,

the Pope lists several signs of hope. He sees some of these signs in our time, but also calls us to "be" the signs of hope.

Among these signs of hope he calls us to observe, he lists a desire for world peace, and enthusiasm for life. He calls us to be signs to prisoners, those who are sick, the young, the elderly, and the poor.

To reflect more deeply on hope, the Holy Father uses the image of an anchor. He writes: "The image of the anchor is eloquent; it helps us to recognize the stability and security that is ours amid the troubled waters of this life, provided we entrust ourselves to the Lord Jesus. The storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death. This hope, which transcends life's fleeting pleasures and the achievement of our immediate goals, makes us rise above our trials and difficulties, and inspires us to keep pressing forward, never losing sight of the grandeur of the heavenly goal to which we have been called."

Please keep your eyes and ears open to events around our Archdiocese and around the world. While I don't expect that we will be making a pilgrimage to Rome as a parish for this event, there are opportunities for

volunteers to help assist at some of the events in Rome, so that is an option to consider as well. You can find information on the official website www.iubilaeum2025.va.





Dialogue for Justice: Catholic Advocacy to Reduce Poverty

If there ever was a Gospel that shouts "Justice!" this is it. John the Baptist says, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise" (Lk 3:11). As Americans, we live in luxury when compared with much of the world. One of the signs of the excess in which we live is the proliferation of storage units in which we put our extra

stuff. Our houses and garages are so full of things we resort to renting storage space for all our "must have items." It's been said that the things we stuff into our cupboards, closets, garages, and storage units rob the poor of their necessities. The new Church year calls for new spiritual efforts to build a community committed to social justice. Wouldn't our lives be less burdensome if we rid ourselves of the things that begin to own us? Our baptism commits us to a life of simplicity and a concern

All about Antiphons on Gaudete Sunday

Antiphons are short chants in Christian ritual, sung as a refrain. They are used during Mass: sung at the Entrance (or Introit), during the Offertory, and during distribution of Holy Communion. The traditional name given for the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, is from the Entrance Antiphon: Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete. This translates to "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice." Did you know these are always printed here in our bulletin and are found in the Lumen Christi missals in the pews? In addition to this antiphon, we can also celebrate Advent by becoming familiar with the "O" Antiphons:

The "O" Antiphons accompany the Gospel Canticle of Vespers (Evening Prayer) from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present hopes as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. These antiphons form the basis of the verses of the Advent hymn O Come O Come Emmanuel.

Dec. 17 - O Sapientia: O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation.

Dec. 18 - O Adonai: O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.

Dec. 19 - O Radix Jesse: O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.

Dec. 20 - O Clavis David: O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel, controlling at your will the gate of heaven: Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom.

Dec. 21 - O Oriens: O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

Dec. 22 - O Rex Gentium: O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, come and save the creature you fashioned from the dust.

Dec. 23 - O Emmanuel ("God with us"): 0 Emmanuel, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God.



Q&A

Question: With Christmas fast approaching, can you give me some practical tips to prepare myself and my family that will help us stay grounded in what this holiday is really about? With all the commercialism, it's easy to stray.

Answer: Happy times and events bring fond memories and a renewed sense of love and kinship with others. The anticipation is half the joy of the event itself. The coming of the Lord is that kind of event that people have been looking forward to for generations with fervent hope and desire. It gave them strength and courage as they waited for the coming of the Lord.

We know that Christmas is rushed. Sales begin in August and carols blare long before the season begins. Everyone laments the commercial aspects of the season, but as Advent begins, do something to help you be more mindful of the Lord's coming. Use an Advent wreath, or enthrone the Bible prominently, or read the readings from the Bible assigned to each day. Postpone the tree and decorations until closer to Christmas. Establish new family rituals, customs and prayers that help remind everyone that we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Fasting, daily Mass, a special celebration of reconciliation, reaching out to those alienated from family or society, and visiting the homebound manifest the love of the Christ Child and the Holy Family. Resist the temptation to rush the season. In his own time and in his own way, God will come. Our task is simply to be watchful and ready..


