A Word from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Is there a better Christmas hymn than O Holy Night? The answer is no. There isn't. It is hands down the best, and it isn't a debate, so don't come at me trying to tell me I'm wrong, unless you want to lose any influence over me that you may have gained in the last six months.

When I think of the song I of course think of the gorgeous melody, and the crescendo at that final "Divine" belted out by the singer. No Christmas hymn has a more powerful moment. Although the melody stands out, there are also a few profound lyrics that I think need to be acknowledged.

${\it I}$ Long lay the world in sin and error pining, Till He appeared, and the soul felt its worth. ${\it I}$

A powerful lyric, that speaks to the reality of many worn souls. Sin isn't just breaking a rule. The word for sin in Hebrew, Kata, literally means, "Missing the Mark." It means that you try to hit a target and miss. Well, a lot of people are trying to fill their hearts, but they miss the mark. What they do for love doesn't hit the spot. That is the human condition at its worst. We are in error, pining for some relief, and hating ourselves because we can't seem to get things right.

Have you ever had a moment where your soul suddenly felt its worth? Have you ever gone from feeling completely worthless and unworthy of love, to experiencing the love of God? Because that is what the lyrics convey and they convey it very well. This is what we should always be trying to convey to others... to help their soul feel its worth.

Dialogue for Justice: Catholic Advocacy to Reduce Poverty

Mary and Elizabeth greet one another out of joy because they recognize the blessings they have received from God (Lk 1:41). Their lives are an expression of overflowing gratitude for the children they are bearing. These two humble women are rich in the blessings given them by the Lord God. They recognize their blessings in the gift of their everyday lives. Their lives were sacred journeys.

And so, it is the same with our lives as well. We journey in God's goodness. Have we ever considered our lives as sacred journeys? Frederick Buechner invites us to reframe our lives when he proposes to "try listening to my life as a whole...for whatever of meaning, of holiness, of God, there may be in it to hear." So how do we hear God calling us this new Church year to be a people of justice? The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1807) tells us that "justice is the moral virtue that consists in

need— to our weakness is no stranger. ♪

This is from the oft omitted second verse of the song, so the lyric might be unfamiliar to you, but it speaks to the reality that the love of God draws close to us. God does not run from us when we are in need, as many do. God draws close to us and endures our trials with us. He is a friend who opens himself up to experience some of the burdens that life throws at us.

God knows the needs of the human heart. He knows the need for love and in some odd way, he has experienced that need himself. But he also shows us how to fill the needs of the heart, to lead us into love and peace. He shows us how to love the Father, and to love others. Hence the third verse:

S Truly He taught us to love one another; His law is love and His gospel is peace. S

Love isn't something that we know with our instincts. When we rely on instincts and feelings to find true love, we often find ourselves broken hearted, and in that place of the above lyric pining for relief in our error. We need to be taught to love and, when we love rightly, we experience the peace of the Gospel.

I hope everyone has a truly wonderful Christmas and can enter into the joy of the Gospel that this wonderful hymn explains so well.



Reflect on the Liturgy

Vigil Mass Readings: Isaiah 62:1-5, Psalm 89, Acts 13:16-17, 22-25, Matthew 1:1-25

First Reading: For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. (Isaiah 9:5)


While in exile in Babylon, Isaiah foresaw and celebrated the time when Israel would declare, "All the ends of the earth can see the salvation of our God." How will you celebrate the birth of Jesus?

Second Reading: The grace of God has appeared, saving all and training us to reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly, and devoutly in this age. (Titus 2:11-12)

The opening verses of Hebrews describe Jesus as the "very imprint" of God's glory. What do you think the author meant by describing Jesus in this way?

Gospel: "For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord." (Lk 2:11)

St John opens his Gospel with the same first words of the Old Testament, "In the beginning..." He sees the birth of Jesus, "the Word became flesh," as creation itself beginning anew. Do you find this an interesting way to think about the birth of Jesus?


