

Reflect on the Sunday Liturgy

First Reading: "I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will settle you upon your land; thus you shall know that I am the LORD. I have promised, and I will do it, says the LORD. The prophet Isaiah teaches us that the Lord forgets our sins and offers us a new beginning so that we might praise him. What could you do today to honor and praise the Lord?

St. Paul tells the believers in Phillipi of his deep desire and hope to know Jesus and the power of his resurrection. In what ways have you drawn closer to Jesus during this season of Lent?

Gospel: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (Jn 11:25) *or* "But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." (Lk 15:32)

Jesus showed mercy toward the sinful woman when others were quick to judge her. Is there someone in your life who you could show mercy over judgment this week?

Communion Antiphon The Lord anointed my eyes: I went, I washed, I saw and I believed in God.



Welcome Home

St. Columban Parish proclaims the Roman Catholic faith to the communities of McKenna, Nisqually, Rainier, Roy, Tenino, and Yelm in southeast Thurston and southwest Pierce counties. Our community has grown since its origins at the former St. Margaret Mary Church in McKenna, and our current church in Yelm is named for the Irish-born 6th century missionary to Europe St. Columbanus of Bobbio. We have also been present in Tenino since 1891 through St. Peter Mission, named for the apostle and first pope.

Since July 2024, Sacred Heart Parish in Lacey, St. Columban Parish, and St. Peter Mission formed into Parish Family 40 under our pastor, Very Rev. Bryan Ochs.

A Word from our Pastor

This is the latest installment of Fr. Bryan's series on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We recommend that you consult the bulletins from the weekend of March 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 23rd in order to understand the context of this column.

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we touched on the difference between a transactional approach to confession and a relational approach to confession. In that column, I tried to dissuade you from letting the calendar determine



when you go to confession and instead being attentive to God speaking to you internally and calling you to the Sacrament.

Of course, this isn't easy. There are many voices that we hear, and not all of them are God's. It can be hard to tell which voices are from God and which aren't. This week I want to talk about one of those voices that we sometimes mistake for God's voice that can have an impact on our experience of confession. It is the voice of the one who accuses us.

Many people go to confession very often because they listen to the voice telling them that they are bad, that they are dirty, or that they are failures. People who listen to these accusations often feel intense guilt and run to the sacrament of reconciliation very impulsively. They will then often go back to the sacrament frequently because they question their own sincerity. We sometimes call people like this, "Scrupulous."

In scripture, it does not seem as though God attacks ordinary people for their sins that are committed out of weakness. Yes, there are times in scripture where God, and even Jesus himself, have very harsh words for certain sins, however these are typically people in positions of religious or secular power or to his people as a whole. God is tough on people with this authority, but in scripture we see he is remarkably gentle with individuals who struggle out of personal weakness.

Unless you are a person with a great deal of power, the

voice in your head accusing you of sin probably isn't God's and you shouldn't act on that voice. You should renounce it. God's voice will never lead you to that type of discouragement. Don't let that voice drive any of your actions, including going to confession. We should not let the voice of the evil one drive us to anything. In fact, he might be driving us to an improper experience of confession to rob it of its power to heal and reinforce harmful ideas about God, including the harmful idea that God obsesses over our weakness.

So what does God's voice sound like when he calls us to confession? I think the story of the prodigal son can help. In that famous story (found in Luke Chapter 15) the young son was moved to return to his father not because of his own self-hatred, but because he came to understand and appreciate more deeply the goodness of his father who even treated his hired hands better than he had been treated in his life of dissipation.

Think back to the second column of this series about the biblical definition of sin, which means, "Missing the Mark." When we sin, we try to grasp at something only to discover that what we grasped at did not fulfill us, and that God in his goodness had something better for us all along. This is what should drive us to confession. A deep awareness of God's goodness and an awareness that we settled for less than he wanted for us. If you haven't gotten to that point, then you might not be ready for confession yet. I want to encourage you to spend more time reflecting on God's goodness and what He wanted to give you before you rush into the confessional.

At St. Columban's in Yelm there is a little notebook in the confessional that we use to tally the number of confessions we hear. The other day I noticed on the cover that someone had written, "God calls you by name. The devil calls you by your sin." I'm not sure which of my predecessors wrote that (I'm guessing Fr. Thompson) but I found it important to reflect on and I want to encourage you to reflect on it as well. If you feel called to confession only because of your sin, its best not to respond. If, however, you feel God in his goodness calling you by name to something more, then you are ready for that sacrament.

Faith Formation

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

1439 The process of conversion and repentance was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father: the fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome: the father's joy-all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. The beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life-pure, worthy, and joyful-of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart of Christ who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way.



Abstinence from eating meat - Ages 14 and older on Fridays

Fasting (ages 18-59 Ash Wednesday & Good Friday) When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to another full meal.

Who is excused from fasting and abstinence? The physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes, as well as pregnant or nursing women.

Dialogue for Justice: Catholic Advocacy to Reduce Poverty

The definition of prodigal is "one who spends or gives lavishly and foolishly." The parable in today's Gospel could be interpreted as being more about a prodigal father. It is the father who gives his love lavishly and foolishly to both sons. Neither one "deserves" the kind of love this generous father bestows on them. Both have acted without much regard to the love their father shows them. He is the one who has turned the other cheek. He is the one who has shown generosity. He is the one who is gracious and forgiving to the nth degree. Jesus, of course, is describing the God of love with whom he has such an intimate relationship. He wants us to know that God "spends or gives lavishly and foolishly" to everyone. This "everyone" includes all of humanity friend and foe alike. As disciples of the Lord Jesus, are we able to find a lesson of justice in this parable? An example of this might include those who invaded Ukraine. How easy is it for us to pray for the invading soldiers? How easy is it for us to pray for their country's leader? Probably not at easy at all. Since when was it supposed to be easy to be a Christian? If we take the word of God at face value, then we know our journeys are ongoing. Lent emphasizes this aspect of our faith. There are challenges every day to live the Gospel of our Lord, Jesus. "Generosity is the fullness of heart that results from sharing...ourselves for the well-being of others" (Pope Francis). Perhaps we could add an additional Lenten practice this week...to "lavishly and foolishly" pray for those who "drive us crazy!"



Pero ahora, estos ahorros en los costos le permiten mantener a su familia y cubrir las matrículas escolares.
