# Welcome Home

## Reflect on the Sunday Liturgy

**Readings:** Acts 5:12-16/Ps 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 (1)/Rv 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19/Jn 20:19-31

**Entrance Antiphon** Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia. *Or* Receive the joy of your glory, giving thanks to God, who has called you into the heavenly kingdom, alleluia.

**First Reading:** Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. (Acts 5:12)

*In the aftermath of Jesus' resurrection, the Apostles performed "many signs and wonders," healing the sick and exorcising unclean spirits. Is there something in your life that needs healing?*

**Psalm:** Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting. (Ps 118)

**Second Reading:** When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid." (Rv 1:17)

*St. John is initially frightened at the strange vision of Jesus, but Jesus reassures him, "Do not be afraid." How does Jesus calm your fears?*

**Gospel:** On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:19)

*The resurrected Jesus' first words to his disciples are "Peace be with you." How could you be a peacemaker this week with a family member or neighbor?*

## A Word from our Vicar

Dear Beloved Parish Family of St. Columban, St. Peter, and Sacred Heart,

Easter Greetings to you all! As the gentle warmth of spring begins to paint our local landscape with new life, our hearts, too, are invited to bloom with an even deeper understanding and embrace of God's boundless mercy. Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, a day of extraordinary grace that reminds us of the profound depth of God's love for each and every one of us.

What exactly is Divine Mercy? Simply put, Divine Mercy is when God's love meets us and helps us during our suffering and sin. It is the Lord stepping out in compassion to assist us, His poor, weak, and broken children. From this perspective, every good thing we offer or receive, every act of kindness and support within our community, is truly an expression of Divine Mercy. For example, we are blessed with a vibrant community known for its generosity, genuine friendliness, and warm welcome. This spirit is a beautiful reflection of the very heart of Divine Mercy.

*Diary of St. Maria Faustina 699*

The message of Divine Mercy is deeply connected to the life and experiences of a humble Polish nun who died in 1938. She is known and loved throughout the world today as Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska. Saint Faustina was a mystic, a soul chosen by God to receive extraordinary experiences in prayer, including direct appearances and conversations with our Lord Jesus.

Throughout history, God has chosen to reveal specific messages through mystics for particular times. These messages serve various purposes: sometimes to remind us of forgotten truths, at times to offer a warning, often to bring comfort, and always to call us to conversion. These divine communications never contradict the teachings of the Bible but rather illuminate them and bring them into sharper focus for the needs of a specific era.

The message that God entrusted to Saint Faustina for our modern era is a powerful reminder of the very heart of

Sacred Scripture: that His Mercy is greater than our sins, and that we can always return to Him with trust. In her diary, Jesus says, "Let no soul fear to draw near me, even though its sins be as scarlet... my mercy is greater than your sins and those of the entire world." (Diary 699). Jesus yearns for us to turn to Him with unwavering trust, regardless of our past mistakes or present struggles. Just as He, after His glorious Resurrection, showed His wounded side to the doubting Thomas Didymus, inviting him to touch the very source of His sacrifice, so too does God invite each of us to draw near to His merciful heart. As we gaze upon the image of the Divine Mercy, with rays of red and white flowing from the heart of Christ, we are reminded that His love poured out on the Cross is available to us every moment.

In a world often marked by wars, suffering, and uncertainty, God desires to pour out even greater graces. He reminds us through Saint Faustina that our time is a time of extraordinary Mercy, a time when He wishes to bestow particularly abundant blessings upon humanity. This message is a powerful antidote to the anxieties and fears that can weigh us down, offering a profound sense of hope and reassurance.

Through prayer, God opens our hearts to recognize our brokenness and the mercy we need to experience healing and hope. I therefore encourage you, my brethren, to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet, spend time in Adoration if possible, and make a sincere act of trust in Jesus. Let us echo the words that Jesus gave to St. Faustina and now to all of us: "Jesus, I trust in You."

As we celebrate Divine Mercy today, let us take this opportunity to reflect deeply on the immensity of God's love for us. Let us open our hearts with renewed trust to receive the extraordinary graces promised on this special day. Let us also remember the call to be merciful ourselves, extending that same compassion, understanding, and forgiveness to our neighbors, our families, and even those who may be difficult to love.

**If Jesus destroyed sin, why are sins still with us?**

We are the children of God, heirs of the Father's work, which is life. The struggle is between good and evil and the greatest weapon of evil is death. It is final — the end of hope and all possibility of change. Jesus must destroy death so that life, eternal life, might be possible. That is why Jesus dies: to take on sin's weapon and destroy it by his resurrection. It was not to satisfy God's sense of justice, but to meet sin on its own terms and defeat it.



Since we are heirs and coworkers with God, ours is the struggle with the remnants of evil, its last desperate attempt to overcome good. Like Jesus, we are about the Father's business in our daily life, carrying the message of salvation to everyone. We are strengthened in our struggle and come to realize the great gift of life with which we are graced. It is our hope that one day we will rejoice with the Father in a job well done!

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**From the Catechism of the Catholic Church**

**1814** Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that he has said and revealed to us, and that Holy Church proposes for our belief, because he is truth itself. By faith "man freely commits his entire self to God." For this reason the believer seeks to know and do God's will. "The righteous shall live by faith." Living faith "work[s] through charity."

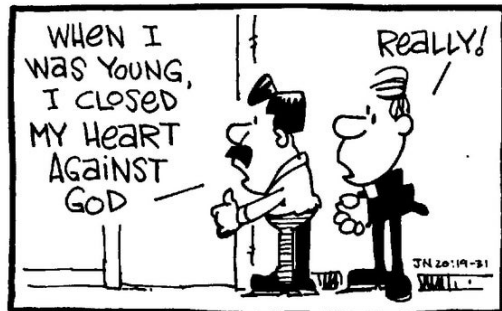

## Dialogue for Justice: Catholic Advocacy to Reduce Poverty

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21). These words are spoken to the disciples who are huddled in the upper room. They are gathered in a state of nervousness as well as confusion. They feared those in power may come for them next. Were they about to be the next innocent victims? They also are puzzled by the news Mary Magdalene has brought to them. Jesus raised from the dead? What does this mean? In this Gospel passage, Jesus now makes himself known to those who are trying to make sense of all that has happened. He appears to them. With these words the torch of bringing the word of God to the people is passed. It is their charge to share with the world the love and mercy of God. How does it feel when we consider these words are spoken to us a well? Are we not his disciples too? Each Sunday we have the Word of God proclaimed and a homily to reflect on how we might use these words to bring about justice. 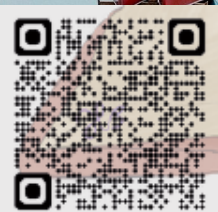

# Remembering POPE FRANCIS

1936—2025

## Biography

Pope Francis—born Jorge Mario Bergolio on December 17, 1936, in Buenos Aires, Argentina—was elected Supreme Pontiff, the 266th pope of the Catholic Church, on March 13, 2013. He is the first Jesuit pope and the first pope from the Americas. Before his election, he served as Archbishop of Buenos Aires and was made a cardinal by Pope John Paul II in 2001. As pope, he emphasized pastoral care, evangelization, and the centrality of God's mercy.



## Papal Motto

Pope Francis' motto, *Miserando atque eligendo* ("by having mercy and by choosing"), comes from a homily by St. Bede on the call of St. Matthew. This phrase held deep personal significance for Pope Francis as he experienced a profound encounter with God's mercy on the Feast of St. Matthew in 1953, which led him to his vocation.

## Prayer for Pope Francis

*O God, who in your Divine Providence chose your servant Pope Francis to be counted among the shepherds of your Church, grant, we beseech you, that through your mercy he may receive the reward of a faithful steward and enjoy forever your presence in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.*

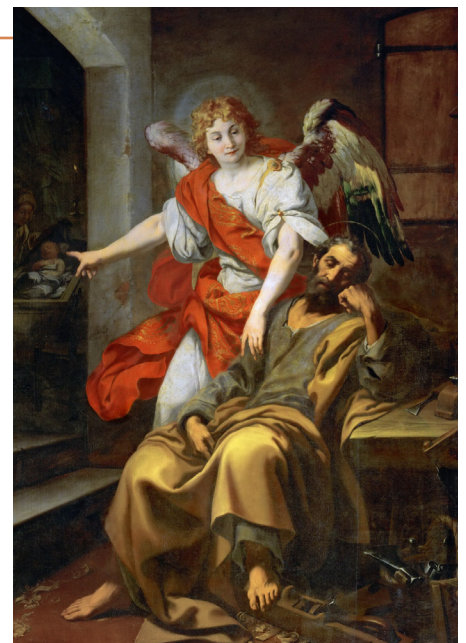
## Pope Francis' Devotion to Mary, Undoer of Knots

## Pope Francis' Devotion to Sleeping St. Joseph

“I have great love for Saint Joseph, because he is a man of silence and strength. On my table I have an image of Saint Joseph sleeping. Even when he is asleep, he is taking care of the Church! ... when I have a problem ... I write a little note and I put it underneath Saint Joseph, so he can dream about it! ... I tell him: pray for this problem!”

## Pope Francis' Devotion to the Five Holy Wounds of Christ

“Lest we go astray on our journey, let us stand before the cross of Jesus: the silent throne of God. Let us daily contemplate his wounds, the wounds that he brought to heaven and shows daily to the Father in his prayer of intercession. Let us daily contemplate those wounds. ... Because there, where we are most vulnerable, where we feel the most shame, he came to meet us.” —Pope Francis (Ash Wednesday Homily, February 17, 2021)

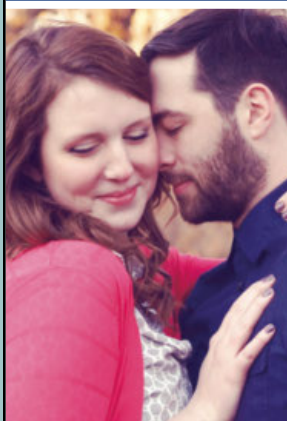
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
