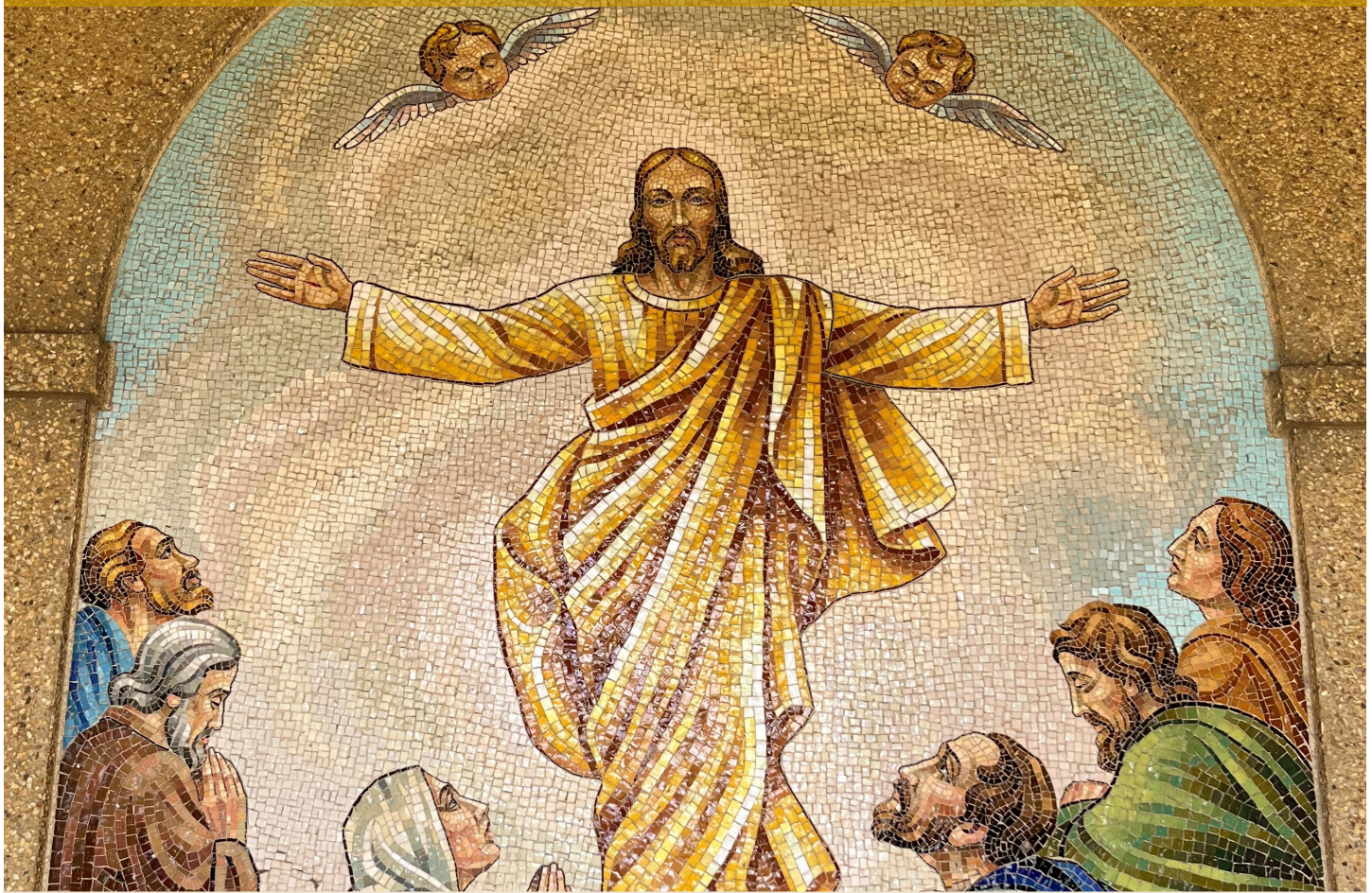

## Reflect on the Sunday Liturgy

**Readings:** Acts 1:1-11/ Ps 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9 (6)/Eph 1:17-23 or Heb 9:24-28; 10:19-23/Lk 24:46-5

**Entrance Antiphon:** Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

**First Reading:** Jesus answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8)

*Just before his ascension into heaven, Jesus commissioned the disciples to be witnesses to the world of his life, death and resurrection. How do you share your faith with friends or neighbors?*

**Psalm:** God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord. (Ps 47)

**Second Reading:** May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. (Eph 1:17)

**Gospel:** As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven. (Lk 24:51)

*The disciples were overcome with joy and thanksgiving, praising God for the gift of the resurrected and ascended Jesus. What gift from God brings you joy?*

## A Word from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

To date, one of the most popular bulletin columns I've written were the ones about books I have read. I've finished a few in the last few months, so here you go.

*All the Light We Cannot See*

by Anthony Doer

I promised a review of this one months ago, and I finally finished it and I really liked it. This is the story of two young people, a blind girl from France and a young German soldier, during World War II. Even though they were quite different, their lives intertwined in a couple of interesting ways. As a fan of good character development, I have to say that this was the strength of the book. The narrative was not all that exciting, to be honest, but the characters were fascinating, and I truly cared about them. As a bonus, the book consisted of lots of very, very short chapters so you could always read a couple extra pages before bed. I highly recommend it.

I also must say that I like Anthony Doer as a writer. For those who like the city of Rome, his book, *Four Seasons in Rome*, is wonderful.

*The Midnight Library*,

by Matt Haig

This book was almost good but was kind of slow. It is about a young English woman, Nora, who after experiencing some serious regrets chooses to take her own life. After overdosing on some medication, she wakes up in a dream state near a library full of books and she meets an interesting librarian from her past who explains to her that each book in the library is a different life Nora Could have lived.

With the help of the librarian, Nora begins to look at other lives she could have had. She sees herself as a pub owner, a scientist, a famous musician, a surf bum in Australia, and many other things all while learning some

important lessons about life along the way. If you've ever seen the movie, *The Family Man*, there are some similar themes. But while *All the Light we Cannot See* was marked by great characters, *The Midnight Library* failed in this way. While this might sound harsh, I just didn't care about the characters to care about what happened to them. And the philosophical insights weren't really that interesting, with some notable exceptions.

So I don't really recommend this book, unless you are looking for a semi-short mindless, easy read to keep you entertained while on vacation.

*The Bell and the River*

by Sister Mary of the Blessed Sacrament McCrosson

Well, this was a pleasant surprise, and I'll start off by saying I recommend this one for any Catholic in the Pacific Northwest. It is the true story of Mother Joseph of the Sisters of Providence founding her mission in our own area! Of course, here we experience the fruit of Mother Joseph's work at St. Peter's hospital, so this one really hits close to home.

It is her biography, and I was blown away with how well this was written. It possessed great insights into historical events, deep spirituality, and it read at times like an adventure novel. Seriously, it was very well done and I'm very glad I happened upon this after two priest friends recommended it to me. It is amazing how our local Church was built up by the courage of these religious sisters and priests who made the harsh trek from Montreal to Vancouver, Washington. You will recognize many places mentioned in this book. Every local Catholic should know this important piece of our history.

### Dialogue for Justice

#### Catholic Advocacy to Reduce Poverty

If you have ever seen a car accident happen, you are an eyewitness. You are someone who saw it and you may be called upon to give testimony to a police officer or in a court room. Jesus describes those who were with him at his Ascension as "witnesses" (Lk 24:48). The faithful disciples were with him during his years of ministry as well. They were witnesses to his miracles. They saw the goodness of God reflected in the ministry of Jesus. He was always showing the goodness and mercy of the Father. Taboos were challenged. Touch the dead. Speak with women. Forgive his executioners. There was no one outside his circle of care and compassion. This concept of witnessing comes to us as his followers. Who do we put outside our circle of care and compassion? ### Saint of the Week

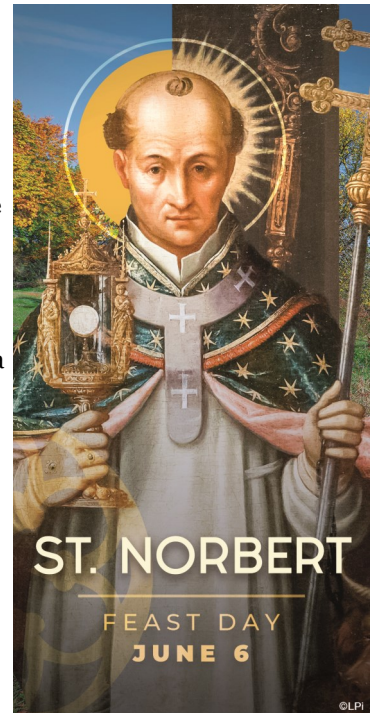
#### St. Norbert (+1134), feast day June 6

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten (c. 1075-1134), was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power, and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded a women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament, this earned him the title "Apostle of the Blessed Sacrament". He and those of his orders had a great love of and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, with a devout faith in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died. St. Norbert of Xanten, pray for us!

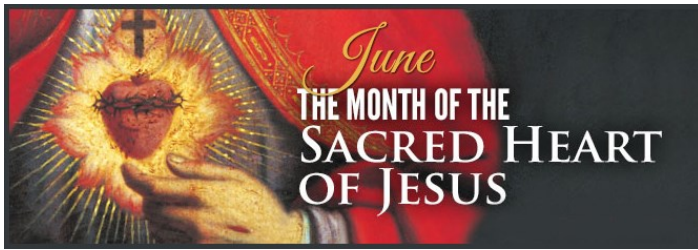

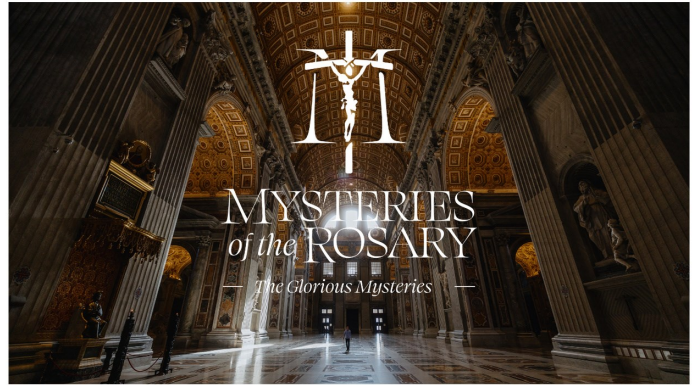

**From Washington bishops to the lay faithful**

Subject: Update on State Law

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As you may know, Governor Ferguson signed into law a provision that seeks to require priests to violate the Seal of the Confessional in some circumstances. Priests are unable to violate the Seal under any circumstances. As the Vatican wrote on the topic in 2019,

The inviolable secrecy of Confession comes directly from the revealed divine right and is rooted in the very nature of the Sacrament, to the point of not admitting any exception in the ecclesial sphere, nor, least of all, in the civil one.<sup>1</sup>


Indeed, the Church has said that “political action or legislative initiative[s] aimed at ‘breaching’ the inviolability of the seal” are “an unacceptable offense against *libertas Ecclesiae*, which does not receive its legitimacy from individual States, but from God.”<sup>2</sup>


Given this troubling development in state law, we are addressing this matter through litigation. While the details of this case are sensitive and will be handled with care, we want to assure you that this action is being taken to protect the mission and integrity of the Church.


The United States and Washington State Constitutions provide robust protection for our faith and we are confident in our legal position. Our attorneys have filed the case, and we will keep you informed as appropriate, while respecting the confidentiality required in such matters.



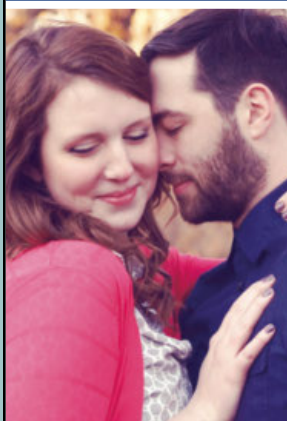
