Reflect on the Sunday Liturgy

Readings: Acts 12:1-11/Ps 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9/2 Tm 4:6-8, 17-18/Mt 16:13-19

Entrance Antiphon: These are the ones who, living in the flesh, planted the Church with their blood; they drank the chalice of the Lord and became the friends of God.

First Reading: “Now I know for certain that the Lord sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people had been expecting.” (Acts 12:11)

In his miraculous escape from prison, St. Peter was convinced of God’s saving work in his life. Where do you see God at work in your life?

Psalm: The angel of the Lord will rescue those who fear him. (Ps 34)

Second Reading: The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly Kingdom. (2 Tm 4:18)

As St. Paul was nearing the end of his life, he realized that God had rescued him from many dangers and threats. As you reflect on your life, can you see times when God’s saving hand was present for you?

Gospel: I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” (Mt 16:19)

Our Lord commissioned St. Peter to be the foundation (“rock”) of his Church. Are there any roles or responsibilities you feel called to do in your parish?



A Word from Deacon Terry

Dear Parish Family,

“Summertime and the livin’ is easy,” so crooned Nat King Cole in the song with the same name. If we let our minds go to an ideal place, we may very well dream up our ideal summer when the living is very easy. So where do your summer dreams lead you? A quiet fishing spot? Sipping a glass of iced tea sitting on your patio? A vacation trip to a location on your bucket list?

We all have an idealized dream of a summer spent doing little to nothing!

There are rare moments when I experience a favorite part of summer. It seems to me that these times are frequently interrupted by events inside or outside of me that suddenly make summertime when the living is not easy. I become restless. Something disturbs my peace. It seems that “livin’ easy” is just too good to be true!

So, what do we make of our restlessness? Ignore it? Enjoy it? Restlessness is part of the nature God instilled in us. One of life’s challenges is to recognize this tendency to be busy and curb it. Our urge to move and to be doing things can be a way to distract ourselves from knowing ourselves and others more fully.

St. Augustine, a very restless soul indeed, wrote his famous treatise entitled *Confessions* which contained this thought: “You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You.” This is perhaps Augustine’s most often quoted phrase. It captures something that resonates deep within the human person. Restlessness is that desire to be filled and fulfilled.

Like so many things in our lives we must discipline ourselves to create our own “deserted places” in order to find rest. Life is fuller when we discipline our desires. For example: If I spend most of my money on frivolous things (movies, online shopping, beer and wine) then I may not have enough money to care for my family (food, rent, clothing). Such an undisciplined life leads to many difficulties and struggles.

How might we know ourselves more fully? In a technology driven world that constantly bombards us with one message after another, how do we “come away...to a deserted place and rest for a while” (Mark 6:31)? The answer lies in how we might interpret this

Gospel passage. Going away to a deserted place does not require a trip to a mountain top. Finding a deserted place can be found in an easy chair, on a porch, sipping a cup of coffee, enjoying a northwest sunset.

God calls each one of us to find Him. We can only find Him if we create a daily moment with God. A time just for Him! This takes discipline. As we reflect on a typical day, where can we find that moment? Once we know where that time is, turn to Him. Say something simple. Say “thank you.” Praise Him. Read one bible verse...just one, or, if you are inspired, a complete passage. Simple discipline can change our lives. A disciplined focus on Christ will most certainly create within us a more restful spirit...a deserted place “where the livin’ is easy” because we rest in Christ.

May we calm our restless spirits this summer (and there is a lot of it left!) to sit with God on our back porch or kitchen counter and simply count our blessings which he bestows on us in abundance. Happy and blessed summer, friends!





Collection for the Archdiocese of the Military Services, USA, July 5-6

Our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), next weekend, a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. 




Saint of the Week:

St. Peter, the patron of our church in Tenino

PETER was of Bethsaida in Galilee, and as he was fishing on the lake was called by Our Lord to be one of His apostles. He was poor and unlearned, but candid, eager, and loving. In his heart, first of all, grew up the conviction, and from his lips came the confession, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God;" and so Our Lord chose him, and fitted him to be the Rock of His Church, His Vicar on earth, the head and prince of His apostles, the centre and very principle of the Church's oneness, the source of all spiritual powers, and the unerring teacher of His truth. All Scripture is alive with him; but after Pentecost he stands out in the full grandeur of his office. He fills the vacant apostolic throne; admits the Jews by thousands into the fold; opens it to the Gentiles in the person of Cornelius; founds, and for a time rules, the Church at Antioch, and sends Mark to found that of Alexandria. Ten years after the Ascension he went to Rome, the centre of the majestic Roman Empire, where were gathered the glories and the wealth of the earth and all the powers of evil. There he established his Chair, and for twenty-five years labored with St. Paul in building up the great Roman Church. He was crucified by order of Nero, and buried on the Vatican Hill. He wrote two Epistles, and suggested and approved the Gospel of St. Mark. Two hundred and sixty years after St. Peter's martyrdom came the open triumph of the Church. Pope St. Sylvester, with bishops and clergy and the whole body of the faithful, went through Rome in procession to the Vatican Hill, singing the praises of God till the seven hills rang again. The first Christian emperor, laying aside his diadem and his robes of state, began to dig the foundations of St. Peter's Church. And now on the site of that old church stands the noblest temple ever raised by man; beneath a towering canopy lie the great apostles, in death, as in life, undivided; and there is the Chair of St. Peter. All around rest the martyrs of Christ—Popes, Saints, Doctors, from east and west—and high over all, the words, "Thou art Peter, and on this Rock I will build My Church." It is the threshold of the apostles and the center of the world.

Reflection.—Peter still lives on in his successors, and rules and feeds the flock committed to him. The reality of our devotion to him is the surest test of the purity of our faith.

A Brief History of St. Peter Church in Tenino

On the occasion of the named feast day of Sts. Peter and Paul, we offer you this brief history of St. Peter Church in Tenino, with information provided by Sherry Bachmann.

St. Peter Catholic Church was established in 1891 and has been a mission church of St. Michael Olympia and St. Columban Yelm, with occasional staffing by priests from St. Martin's Abbey and Kennedy High School.

The first location was a small wooden structure in south Tenino with a choir loft and pump organ. It used The structure was heated with a wood stove. It eventually was vacated and was used was burned down by the fire department for training purposes.

The community's second location was purchased from the Tenino Presbyterian church for \$5,000. The building had beautiful stained glass windows and no bathroom. While at that location, St. Peter was gifted with the Stations of the Cross, brass tabernacle, brass candle sticks, an altar with the last supper on the front of it, and the large crucifix which now hangs in the current location's narthex. These items were all rescued from the hospital chapel in Walla Walla. Earl Schaefer of Tenino was doing work on the chapel, and the hospital wanted all new items, so they donated everything to him for St. Peter in Tenino.

The property across the street from that location was purchased for a new site. The building on this third location was completed in 1982. The bell from the bell tower and all of the items from the second location were put in the new church except the altar which could not be easily moved. Over the years there have been many upgrades and improvements.

Desde los primeros discípulos de Jesús y sus apóstoles y continuando hasta el presente, los cristianos han ofrecido sus propios recursos para ayudar a la misión de la Iglesia de predicar el Evangelio y para responder a las necesidades de los pobres. 
