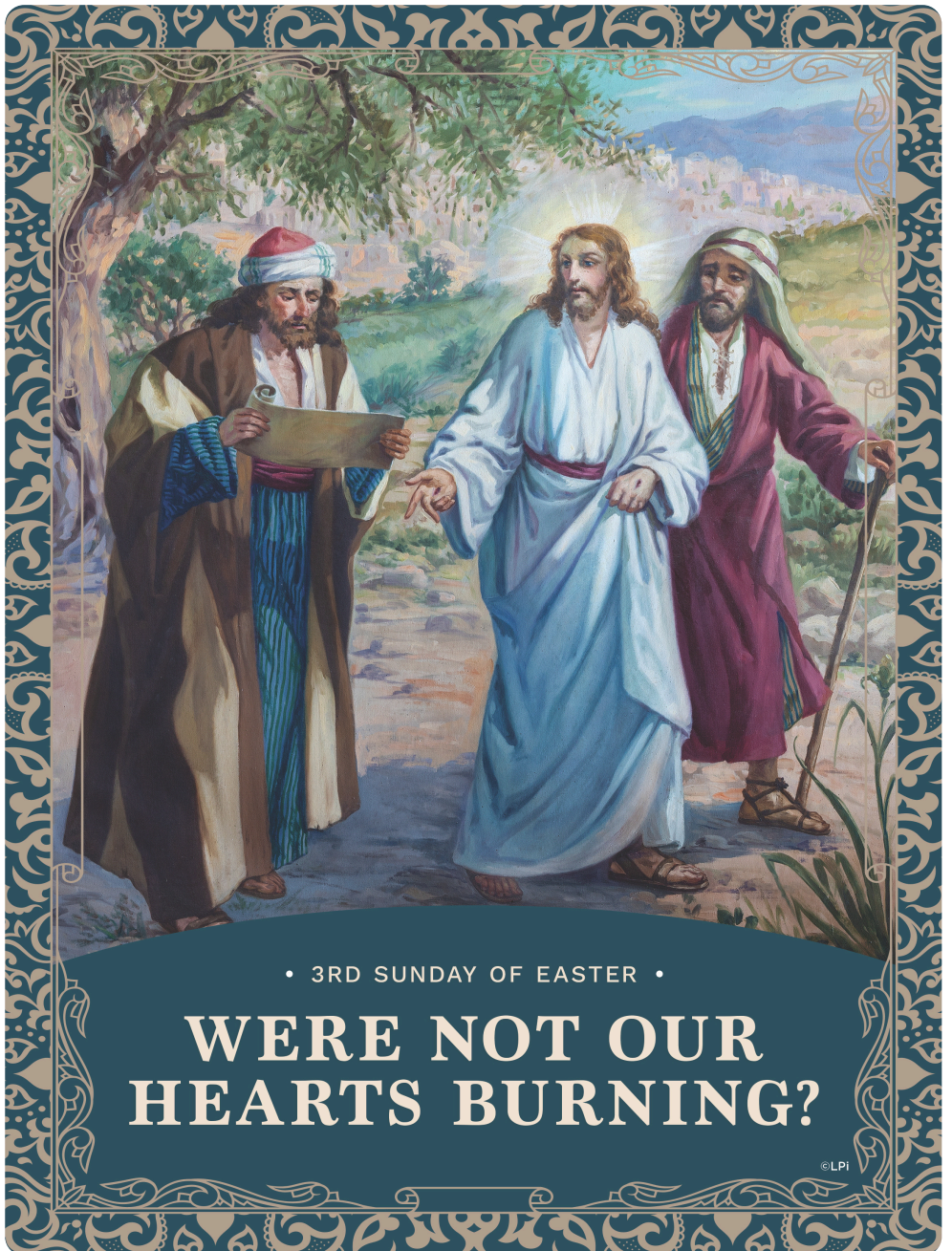

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners

Here are a few updates on things going on around our communities. Some of these go back quite a ways, but I'm not sure they were ever officially announced.

Wonderful Easter Celebrations: Thank you to everyone who helped make Easter at our family of Churches such a great experience. Masses were jam-packed at each location. St. Columban had over 800 people total, which I believe is a record, and Sacred Heart was overflowing at each Mass and had people sitting in the Hall. I don't know the specific numbers for St. Peter, but Fr. William told me it was jammed. As nice as this is, it can also be stressful for staff and volunteers, so thank you to everyone who was patient and kind as we celebrated the resurrection.

New Staff Members: We have had a lot of staffing changes at Sacred Heart in Lacey and St. Columban in Yelm. In Yelm, Gaby M. left her position as coordinator of children's faith formation and OCIA (the process by which people convert to Catholicism) at the end of 2025, and we now have two people who have taken over her roles. Debera R. is now in charge of our children's faith formation, and Pam D. is in charge of OCIA.

At Sacred Heart there have been a lot of changes and a lot of shifting. Claudia T. who coordinated baptisms and marriage prep, will be leaving our staff in May to move to the east coast, and Deacon Terry B. is retiring soon (you will still see Deacon Terry serving as a deacon at Mass). We have hired Victoria F. to take over Claudia's role for Spanish speakers and to serve as a needed administrative assistant for our faith formation staff. Debera R. (the same Debera R. as above in Yelm) will be coordinating marriage prep and baptism prep in English. Emely F. who currently serves as Sacred Heart's receptionist will be coordinating Spanish Ministry for the parish family.

That is a very quick explanation of the changes, and I want to make special mention of Gaby M., Claudia T., and Deacon Terry B. Each of them have been an incredible help to our parishes and to me personally, and I am sad that they will be departing.

Partners in the Gospel: Lots of work continues to happen during our reorganization. Based on feedback from Community Conversations, the Advisory Committee and I are formulating our vision statement and our core values and core initiatives. After our vision statement, core values, and core initiatives are determined they will be put before the parish for comment, and we will begin the final stretch, asking difficult questions of what changes need to happen to make these initiatives flourish. Pray for us!

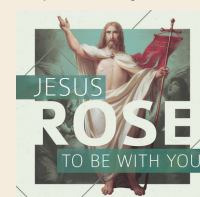

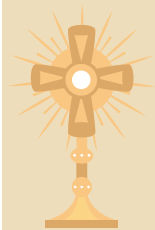

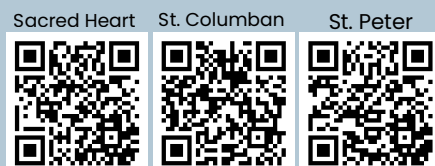

The Rosary, Explained

Christians have used beads to mark the recitation of prayers since ancient times. In the 12th century, the Rosary emerged as a meditative devotion centering on significant moments in the lives of Jesus and Mary. In the words of St. Leo XIII, “there is no more excellent way of praying.”

The Rosary is traditionally attributed to a Marian vision received by St. Dominic de Guzman (1170–1221). Though scholarship on this point is uncertain, the Dominican Order was undoubtedly crucial in establishing and evangelizing the Rosary as a devotional prayer.

Over the centuries, the formula of the devotion eventually took the shape of 50 Hail Marys divided into five “decades,” with each decade focused on a different mystery. The Church has defined the Joyful Mysteries (to be recited on Saturdays and Mondays), the Glorious Mysteries (Sundays and Wednesdays), the Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays and Fridays), and most recently the Luminous Mysteries (to be recited on Thursdays).

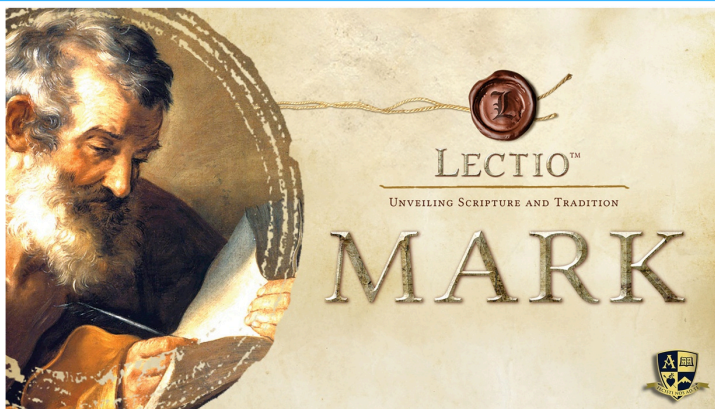
